Board Report: March 16, 2021

- **Registration is Open for the 2021-22 School Year:** DES is excited to start our registration process for incoming kindergartners and Prekindergarten students. Families may pick up a registration packet from the elementary school lobby for DES Kindergarten and BOCES prekindergarten programs. We are also including informational brochures for Head Start preschool options; families can contact Mohawk Valley Community Action for specific registration details. - **Puppets in Education at DES!** Shawn Sponable of Fuccillo Chevrolet of Nelliston generously nominated Dolgeville Elementary to receive five free puppet performances on Friday, March 5th through the Puppets in Education Program. Performances focused on kindness and anti-bullying. Students attending school in-person were able to view live virtual performances. Students in cohort A were able to view a recorded performance. Special thanks to the Puppets in Education program and Fuccillo Chevrolet of Nelliston!
- **Teacher Support Network Meetings:** Our TSN team evaluated student needs at each grade level on Wednesday, March 3. The level of student learning needs is extremely heightened given the challenges we have faced this academic year. Grade level teams focused on social emotional challenges and gaps in learning and instruction due to the COVID-crisis. With the return of several remote students, we are hoping to re-assign support staff and paraprofessionals to begin to address learning needs at each grade level. Our TSN team will additional work on the collection of data from progress monitoring to determine specific interventions for the unique learning needs of our students.
- **New York State Assessments Update:** At this time, New York State has submitted a waiver to the federal government regarding the possible suspension of state assessments. In a regional administrative meeting on Wednesday, March 10, we were informed of potential obstacles regarding the challenges of state-level waivers and state assessment plans. At this point, state assessments continue to be scheduled and intact for the spring. School districts were asked to complete a survey of district assessments to evaluate how we are assessing student progress in each building. We continue to work with regional leaders on any potential action by the state and federal governments regarding state assessments.
- **Return of Remote Learners:** We look forward to the return of our remote learners to in-person instruction for the 4th quarter. At the elementary level, we are attempting to coordinate the return of as many students as possible before the start of the final quarter, to assist students in their transition back to in-person learning.





Academics

- NY Board of Regents meets March 15th and 16th to determine 3-8 tests and Regents. They announced this month that Chemistry, Physics, US History, and Global History Regents will be cancelled. Federal waivers need to be approved to eliminate the federally mandated Algebra, English, Living Environment, Earth Science, and 3-8 ELA, math, and science tests.
- Sophomores interested in BOCES CTE programs explored programs virtually over three sessions from March 1st-10th. Parents will be able to be involved in a virtual showcase the evening of March 24th.
- Students received progress reports on March 12th (B Group) and March 15th (A Group)
- Our fifth NYSED Meeting on 3/11 focused on parent and student survey data with our CSI plan.
- Any student wanting a quiet place to work on virtual classes, access to internet, a printer, and free lunch is welcome to work in the HS cafeteria on Wednesdays from 8-3 PM. Students struggling with hybrid learning can come on the other four days as assigned.

DEAN OF STUDENTS

1. Duties involving multiple facets of assistance have been split between the two principals involving discipline, student peer mediation, behavior management, supervision, and security.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

1. The junior varsity/varsity girls' and boys' basketball and varsity cheerleading teams began practice on March 1st. Each basketball group completed 2 games at the time of this report. The varsity cheerleaders have participated in both home varsity basketball contests. We had senior night for the varsity boys' basketball and cheerleading teams on March 8th and the girls' basketball team on March 10th. The senior athletes were allowed 2 parents/spectators at this senior night contest. It was a very rewarding experience for these seniors. The home basketball contests have been live-streamed through a link found on the Dolgeville.org website. We have 26 jv/varsity boys' basketball players, 18 jv/varsity girls' basketball players, and 15 varsity cheerleaders. I have included some pictures with this report.
2. Modified girls' and boys' basketball began their skills and drills practice with intersquad scrimmaging on Monday, March 8th. We have roughly 19 girls and 17 boys taking part in this program.
3. I have included a report from Coach Risley about the student-athletes that competed in Alpine Ski racing with this report. Congratulations to those athletes and coach.
4. We are in the process of making schedules for volleyball and football that will have a season running from 4/5 to 5/8.

Re: Transportation review items.

Thursday March 11th. Is the last DOT Inspection for this calendar year. Our score should be 95 % pass rate for this year. The next inspection will not be until July.

Diesel Fuel consumption from January 2019 to January 2020 was 30,933 gallons. Due to the Covid 19 pandemic we only used 13,818 gallons from January 2020 to January 2021.

The DMV is doing a driver audit review. It is a three-part process. I am waiting for the final request for files from them to complete the audit.

Eight staff members have received the first Covid vaccine shot. Six staff members have received the second shot. Two of them have had side effects that kept them from working at least one day after second shot.
